Re: **Administrative Report for the Week Ending May 6, 2022**

ADMINISTRATION

1. 2021 Tax Roll SML Files were provided to the WDOR by the treasurer's staff.
2. Fall 2022 election supply order provided to Milwaukee County Election Commission by clerk's staff.
3. Staff prepared packets for next week's Village Board meeting.
4. Assistant Manager continued interviews for summer pool staff with final consideration on May 11.
5. Assistant Manager held a meeting with representatives of the Wisconsin Athletic Club regarding a programming partnership for the summer at the municipal pool.
6. Assistant Manager received funding from the Fox Point Foundation for the purchase and fabrication of picnic tables.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

1. The Village Forester will be participating in the International Migratory Bird Day walk at Doctor's Park on Saturday, May 7, from 8:00-9:30 AM. Residents are welcome to join the group to celebrate the event. Meet in the parking lot.
2. The Arbor Day event was held at Stormonth last Friday and, after a two-year hiatus due to COVID protocols, was well attended by residents, students, teachers and staff, Village Board trustees, and Village staff. Thank you to all who participated!
3. Staff worked with the Village Attorney regarding two proposed water main/public utility easements along Port Washington Road. These will be on the Board's agenda for consideration next Tuesday.
4. We Energies began the gas main replacement project on Wye Lane this week. Their work is anticipated to last approximately three weeks.
5. Staff is still working with our contractor to finalize the contract documents for the Wye Lane and Port Washington Road work. We are also waiting for the DNR to issue our water permit before work can commence.
6. DPW staff is busy planting trees and expects to complete the work next week. They are also busy collecting yard waste, performing miscellaneous asphalt work, and will begin with landscape restorations where we experienced water main breaks.

7. DPW staff also began pool opening/operating tasks.
8. Staff received word that Truck 4, which was ordered February 2021, has been delivered (finally) to the body builder and we may be able to put the truck in service in July. The other pieces of equipment approved by the board have also been ordered and we will see delivery on those within the next 60-120 days (depending on the equipment).
9. Packer 13 broke down again and was repaired.
10. In the water utility, staff performed the quarterly meter reading, followed up with re-reads, checked for vacant houses, replaced a meter on Whitney Road, discussed the water main repair van with staff and continued with valve turning.
11. Water utility staff also met with a contractor to repair a fire hydrant on Holly Court but the contractor was unable to do so and, as a result, staff picked up a hydrant to replace the one on Holly Court.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

1. Officers responded to a suspicious activity complaint of subjects entering yards and driveways. While checking the area a vehicle fled from officers, crashed, and the driver ran from the scene. Located in the vehicle and in the surrounding area was evidence of thefts of catalytic converters. The investigation remains open while officers attempt to identify the subjects.
2. A resident reported unauthorized transactions on a credit card totaling over \$4800.00. Investigation is on-going.
3. Officers took a report of an identity theft after a subject posing as an employee of Norton Lifelock convinced the resident to provide them with access to their bank account and credit card. Unauthorized purchases totaling \$1800.00 were made against the accounts which originated out of the country.
4. Officers were dispatched to a suspicious activity complaint of subjects attempting to get a vehicle out of a front yard. While investigating the incident, a subject on scene fled on foot from officers. Further, a vehicle involved was determined to be stolen out of the City of Milwaukee. The driver was taken into custody and transported to the Milwaukee County Jail where they are awaiting charges from the District Attorney's Office. Attempts to identify the subject who fled are on-going.
5. Officers responded to a report of a weapons complaint after the driver of a vehicle pointed a firearm at the complainant and then drove away from the scene. The incident occurred after the complainant approached the driver and requested they not park their vehicle on the complainant's grass. Officers continue to investigate the identity of the driver.
6. A resident reported an identity theft after an AT&T account was opened in their name and over \$1200.00 was charged to the account. Investigation is on-going.
7. Officers responded to a report of a hit and run accident in the parking lot of Riverpoint Village shopping center. During the investigation it was discovered the complainant held two outstanding warrants through Butler Police Department. The subject was taken into custody and the warrants were satisfied.
8. Officers took a report of a fraud complaint after a resident discovered an unauthorized transfer of \$2500.00 from their bank saving account. Investigation continues.
9. Staff participated in outdoor firearms training and North Shore In-Service.
